**APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

Councilmember Steve Ward moved, seconded by Councilmember Carolyn Karns and carried 4-0, to approve the consent agenda, to include adoption of the agenda, approval of the minutes of the January 4, 2010 Council meeting, and approval of the amended bills.

**GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Louisburg resident Travis Thompson spoke to the Council regarding the vacant Councilmember seat.

**APPOINTMENT OF COUNCIL POSITION**

Mayor Curt Shreckengaust and the Council accepted the resignation of Councilmember Sid Mitchell. Mayor Shreckengaust appointed Steve Town to fill the vacant At-Large position. Councilmember Steve Ward moved, seconded by Councilmember Carolyn Karns and carried 4-0, to approve the appointment of Steve Town to the City Council representing the At-Large position. City Clerk Traci Storey administered the oath of office to Mr. Town.

## **MAYOR'S REPORT**

Mayor Curt Shreckengaust presented a Proclamation for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Councilmember Glena Windisch moved, seconded by Councilmember Steve Ward and carried 5-0, to authorize Mayor Shreckengaust to sign the Martin Luther King, Jr. Proclamation.

## **VISITORS**

Kim Hall owner of the Bungalow Boutique requested permission from the Council for a Valentine's Day Banner. Councilmember Glena Windisch moved, seconded by Councilmember Steve Ward and carried 5-0, to allow a banner at the Bungalow Boutique for a 60-day period.

## **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

City Administrator Jeff Cantrell presented the 2009 Crime Report from the Police Department. Administrator Cantrell noted the number of identity thefts and lockouts that were on the rise. If staffing becomes a critical issue lockouts may need to be removed from the scope of services that are currently provided. Many cities have already eliminated this service. Overall Cantrell was pleased with the department report and noted that the majority of crime was down.

## **CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT**

City Attorney Mary Stephenson stated a conference with the Judge on the Park Meadows case was held on January 12<sup>th</sup>. On February 9<sup>th</sup> a deposition will be held with Ed Thomas. Mediation will be held on February 18<sup>th</sup> and a motion hearing will be held on April 13<sup>th</sup>.
